Dear Rep. John Faso,

I am writing as a concerned constituent over the alarming movement in Washington to weaken or even eliminate the Environmental Protection Agency. Since its creation by President Richard Nixon nearly 50 years ago, the EPA has been the single most important and effective force in cleaning up our land, waters and air. Here in New York, we have eliminated inadequate sewage discharge, dramatically reduced smog and acid rain, and addressed toxic waste sites, all through the efforts of the EPA. - Cutting the Environmental Education and Environmental Justice programs
- Closing the Office of Public Engagement, resulting in even less transparency to the public.
- Cutting grants and programs to support state and regional environmental protections.

It is imperative that our representatives in Washington stand against these dangerous proposals that will cause harm to our environment, families, wildlife and more. I urge you to use your influence and votes to oppose the Trump administration's assault on the EPA. In particular, his budget proposal will face Congressional scrutiny and require approval. You are in a position to speak out against this ill-advised plan. New Yorkers and all Americans want and need a clean place to live and work and the Environmental Protection Agency is essential to achieving that.
